HRAC: "How did you conceive the logo that you submitted?"



"HRAC & Adopt A Spot"

On Saturday March 2nd, the Hampton Roads Alumni Chapter participated in its first "Adopt-a-Spot" clean up project. This program is part of the Keep Norfolk Beautiful initiative supported by the Norfolk Environmental Commission (NEC), a non-profit organization and a branch of the City of Norfolk Department of Public Works. There were a total of eight brothers who participated and Brother Alicia Farrow headed up the project for this day. The overall goal and requirements after "Adopting a Spot" included the following: a minimum two-year commitment, a minimum of four clean up initiatives per year as well as reporting all litter collected and discarded after each scheduled clean up. The HRAC's Adopt-a-Spot location is one mile in length on 41st street - Killam Avenue to Powhatan Avenue in Norfolk, Virginia.

Participating in the Adopt A Spot program presented an opportunity for brothers to become more engaged with the community and illustrate our desire to keep the environment clean and safe! We do this to set an example and although we are a professional group, we know how to "get our hands dirty" as well!
